ABSTRACT:

Citizenship is one of the important social ideas and one of the significant entities in democratic and political systems and it is an index to show the presence of democracy in the society. Citizenship ethic is one of the important concept or ideas that are used in reviewing the relationship of individual and society. The main function of citizenship is to control society based on the respect of each other's rights and commitment to perform one's rules in maintenance of systems that keep these rights stable. Regarding historical sociology of citizenship and improvement of domains to provide situations for citizenship in Iran emerged after Islamic Revolution in 1979. A condition of democratic and people centered society is the presence of citizens who are obedient and informed about the social behavior. In this study the conceptualizing of citizenship includes contributions, citizenship rights, social duties and socialism. This study is trying to analyze the scale of younger people's commitment to citizenship ethic according to socio-economic institute's index which is performed by the application of gauging method. The results showed that socio-economic institute has a meaningful influence on the scale of commitment to citizenship ethic.
